Spring newsletter 2025

There are over 50 species of orchid in Britain, ranging from the abundant common spotted orchid to the rare ghost orchid, a species that was seen in 2024 for the first time since 2009. Orchids can pop up unexpectedly almost anywhere. They can be found on roadside verges or appear suddenly in suburban gardens. In 2022 a single pyramidal orchid was found for the first time on Avon Meadows at Pershore but hasn't been seen since then.

Orchids can be seen from April (early purple) to September (autumn lady's-tresses) but the best time to spot them is in May or June. It is in June that we will be visiting the Vale Landscape Heritage Trust (VLHT) nature reserve of Hipton Hill Orchards near Evesham. The walk will be led by VLHT's Gary Farmer.

At Hipton Hill there are usually good numbers of common spotted and pyramidal orchids, plus a small number of bee orchids, but perhaps the star species is the greater butterfly orchid. In a good season an impressive 300 plants can produce up to 3000 flower spikes; numbers vary from year to year depending on the weather. Ideal conditions are lots of sunshine in the growing season, as well as cold temperatures in the winter and not too much rain. Basically, like the rest of the UK's wildlife, this species needs proper seasons, which do seem to be getting rarer. With our weather patterns changing, conservation organisations, including Worcestershire Wildlife Trust and VLHT, face increasing landscape management challenges.
